624 MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR DECEASED MEMBERS OF Y'S MEN'S CLUBS

PROCEDURES

1. Hold the service at the regular time of the club meeting as soon as possible after the funeral of the member.

2. Have only the members of the club and the Y's Menettes attend the service.

3. Organize the room for the service so that only the leader and participants in the service are at the front and provide a lecturn or podium for them. Other details, such as, candles, appropriate lighting, etc. can be left to the discretion of the organizers.

4. Have one member conduct the service but get assistance from other members to participate in the service, for example, one to read Psalm 23, one to read the Scriptures (or the leader can do this), and one to read Words in Memory of the deceased member.

Note: It seems more appropriate for us to use the phrase, Words in Memory, rather than the word, Eulogy.

5. Words in Memory of the deceased member could be approximately 1 1/2 to 2 typed pages in length. They should be typed to facilitate reading. Subsequently, a copy could be forwarded for printing in the Y's Canadian.

6. The duration of the period of silence should be a minimum of 30 seconds.

SERVICE

1. We assemble at this time to solemnly remember and to pay our respects to the life of our member, Y's _____, whose death we mourn, but whose spirit still lives.

May we, as members of the ______ Y's Men's Club of the International Association of Y's Men's Clubs be charged anew with the full sense of out duties and responsibilities to our Club, to our fellow members, and to our organization as set forth in our motto, "To acknowledge the duty that accompanies every right".

2. Psalm 23
